Knowledge-based and Professional Services is one of three key sectors and two emerging sectors identified by the City of Niagara Falls as strengths of the economy.

Knowledge-based and professional services typically engage in activities using human capital as the major input and are a **key driver of the new economy**. Employees' knowledge and skills form the backbone of these services, with subsectors defining the particular areas of expertise. Businesses within the knowledge-based and professional services industry can be thought of as selling expertise as a service.

Over the last decade the Niagara region has seen extensive growth in knowledge based and professional services sectors. Double digit job growth has been seen for specialized design services 24.5% growth, architectural, engineering and related services 17.7%, and scientific research and development 13.5%. Close proximity to two of Canada's largest knowledge-based hubs (the

Greater Toronto Area and Waterloo) provides businesses with access to a rich talent pool. This talent pool, combined with the region's more affordable cost of living, has helped make the Niagara region incredibly competitive in the knowledge-based sector, including being considered

the **3rd most competitive** North American region for digital media.
